#### Introduction

The Minnesota Achieve Scholarship program is designed to address two critical barriers to college attendance: lack of academic preparation and financial access. This program provides a financial incentive for high school students to take rigorous courses to better prepare them for success in postsecondary education. The program, signed into law in May 2007, is available to students who graduate from a Minnesota high school after January 1, 2008.

The purpose of this report is to meet the report requirements of Minnesota Statute 136A.127. The law requires the Minnesota Office of Higher Education to provide an evaluation report by January 15 of each odd numbered year. The evaluation report is to include:

- 1. Demographics of individuals participating in the program;
- 2. Grades scholarship recipients received for courses in the qualifying program;
- 3. Number of scholarship recipients who persisted at a postsecondary institution for a second year;
- 4. High schools attended by the program participants;
- 5. Postsecondary institutions attended by the program participants;
- 6. Academic performance of the students after enrolling in a postsecondary institution; and
- 7. Other information as identified by the director.

#### **Overview of Achieve Scholarship Program**

To be eligible, a student must have a family adjusted gross income of less than \$75,000 reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and complete each course that comprises one of four rigorous programs of study while in high school with a grade C or better (See Appendix 1). The sets of courses are the same sets of courses used to determine eligibility for the Federal Academic Competitiveness Grant.

Eligible students must graduate from a Minnesota high school, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and submit an Achieve Scholarship application along with an official high school transcript. Eligible students receive a one-time award of \$1,200 for a year of postsecondary enrollment, which they may use at an eligible institution in Minnesota any time during the first four years after they graduate from high school. Eligible students designate the term in which they wish to receive the first half of the scholarship. They are eligible to receive the second half of the scholarship in their next term of eligible enrollment.

#### Outcomes

Approximately 3,600 scholarship applications were received as of December 23, 2008. Eleven percent of the applicants were ineligible because they did not meet the academic requirements and five percent were ineligible because they were from families with incomes of \$75,000 or more. An additional eight percent of the applicants were ineligible for other reasons, such as graduating from high school prior to January 1, 2008. The number of ineligible applicants was low for a new financial aid program, an indication that students received good information on program requirements.

Approximately 2,200 students will receive awards totalling \$2.7 million in Fiscal Year 2009. Assuming the number of recipients grows 10 percent per year, the agency estimates Achieve scholarships and administration for the current program will total \$3.1 million in 2010 and \$3.4 million in 2011.

Eligible students graduated from more than 370 different high schools or home school settings and came from nearly every county in the state (See Appendices 2 and 3). Students who have chosen to receive their scholarship award this year are attending more than 75 different postsecondary institutions in Minnesota. Approximately 50 percent of the recipients are attending public colleges or universities while the other 50 percent are attending private institutions in Minnesota (see chart below and Appendix 4 for more detail).

To be eligible, students must have received a grade of 'C' or above in each of the courses that comprise one of the four rigorous programs of study. A majority of the students qualified under Minnesota Coursework Rigorous Program Study (See Appendix 1). In order to expedite the review of transcripts, course-specific grade data was not collected. However, overall high school GPA data will be collected at the end of Fiscal Year 2009.

Eligible students are required to have a family adjusted gross income of less than \$75,000 reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. A majority (56 percent) of the recipients had a family adjusted gross income of \$45,000 to \$74,999.

This is the first award year for the program. Additional demographic data regarding the academic performance of recipients at postsecondary institutions and the number of recipients that persisted for a second year will be available in future reports. Demographic data such as gender and race will also be collected from postsecondary institutions at the end of the Fiscal Year 2009.

### **Appendix A: Rigorous Programs of Study**

To be eligible the student must have completed one of the following four rigorous programs of study while in high school or a home-school setting. Unless otherwise stated, students must earn a C or better in each course:

- *A set of courses similar to the State Scholars Initiative*. This program of study requires passing grades in the following:
  - Four years of English;
  - Three years of math (including Algebra I and a higher level course such as Algebra II, geometry, or data analysis and statistics);
  - Three years of science, including one year each of at least two of the following courses: biology, chemistry, and physics;
  - Three years of social studies; and
  - One year of a language other than English.
- Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) courses and test scores. This
  program requires a minimum of two Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate
  (IB) courses in high school and a minimum passing score on the exams for those classes.
  Students must score 3 or higher on AP exams and 4 or higher on IB exams.
- Minnesota Coursework Requirements. This program requires:
  - Four years of language arts;
  - Three years of math, including one year each of geometry and two years of algebra, one of which is intermediate or advanced algebra;
  - Three years of science including one year each of a biological and physical science;
  - Three years of social studies; and
  - Two years of a single foreign language.
- *Minnesota Dual Credit Program.* With a passing grade of 'B' or better: High School students taking BOTH a math course (Algebra 2 level or higher) AND a science course (biology, chemistry, or physics) under the Post Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program worth a total of at least 6 college credits.
