- All credits earned at any college or university accredited by CHEA (www.chea.org) will be reviewed for application towards the selected degree program. WSU reserves the right to determine whether previous course work provides a suitable base for advanced study. All students have the right to appeal credit transfer decisions following <u>WSU</u> procedures (PDF). WSU also complies with Minnesota State <u>system transfer credit</u> appeal procedure (3.21.1) Currently-enrolled students can use an online WSU <u>appeal</u> credit transfer decisions form.
- Transfer credits meet WSU general education requirements if you have earned an AA degree after May 1985; you have earned a BA or BS; or if you have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC). AS or AAS degrees must fulfill the MnTC in order to waive WSU general education requirements.
- Students may also use <u>Transferology</u> to determine transferability of coursework. You may speed the transfer process up by having additional documentation of your curriculum of courses, including syllabi, sample assignments, course outlines etc. Major course equivalency decisions are made by the faculty in major departments and credits into the General Education Program is determined by the GEP Subcommittee and Director. <u>Minnesota Transfer</u> has many tools and resources to assist transfer students.
- WSU complies with Minnesota State College and University guidelines, such as Undergraduate Course Credit Transfer <u>Policy</u> (3.21) and <u>Procedure (3.21.1); Minnesota Transfer Curriculum</u> (3.37.1); and Transfer <u>Rights and Responsibilities</u> (3.39).

* Incoming Transfer students should be aware that to be eligible for graduation under a four-year curriculum a student must complete a minimum of 120 credit hours, complete at least 30 credit hours in residence during the junior and senior years combined, complete at least 40 credit hours of 300-400 level coursework, complete the General Education Program requirements, and earn a minimum WSU cumulative GPA of 2.00.
